R. Clinton Crews is an education director and trainer with CoalitionsWork, a consulting group based in the Hampton Roads region of eastern Virginia that is dedicated to building coalitions and partnerships for community health. He is a faculty member at Eastern Virginia Medical School (EVMS) in Norfolk, Virginia. Mr. Crews' expertise is in the areas of community and resource needs assessment, health planning and conference development. Mr. Crews lectures on research methods for the Health Professions programs at EVMS and is a member of several committees for the EVMS Master's in Public Health program. He also serves as a national board member for the Patient Advocacy Leadership Summit and the Accreditation Review Committee for Surgical Assistant Education. Previously, he was the research coordinator for the CDC coalition demonstration project CINCH, a trainer for the national Immunization Coalition Training Institute, and the director of Virginia's state immunization coalition, Project Immunize Virginia. Clint served as the Educational Director for Men Against Breast Cancer's (MABC) three National Male Caregiver Conferences as well as Director of MABC's Partners In Survival training program. These coalitions and organizations promote grassroots involvement to address community health needs using partnership building methods. Mr. Crews served as a consultant to the Maryland Partnership for Prevention coalition which received the Vice President's National Partnership for Reinventing Government's Hammer Award in 1998.
